Pupil Premium Priorities – 2021-2022

Our Intent

The core priority for the Weald of Kent in relation to our disadvantaged students is to ensure that differences are diminished, gaps are closed and each individual student is supported to achieve their potential and realise academic excellence and personal success.

Specific Priorities for Implementation

1. The PPG is to be used to ensure that specific learning gaps that have arisen as a result of Covid-19's impact on learning are closed and suitable interventions and support including the provision of one to one tutoring is accessed for eligible students.
2. The PPG is to be used to ensure that all our eligible students have access to uninterrupted learning via school supplied electronic devices, so that any streamed lessons are accessible to all. In addition, all eligible students are supplied with an electronic reading device to support their wider reading and enhance their access to cultural capital.
3. The PPG is to be used to ensure the provision of free of charge intervention sessions both within school time and the school holidays that are run by subject specialist staff, in order to raise the levels of attainment and support the progress of all disadvantaged students.
4. The PPG is to be used to ensure specialist external support that will benefit our disadvantaged students such as Art Therapy and EP provision is accessed.
5. The PPG is to be used to ensure that all disadvantaged students have any necessary curriculum resources, or equipment provided for them.
6. The PPG is to be used to ensure the provision of any necessary individual learning support via Student Services, or external providers, including diagnostic testing, as required by any disadvantaged students.
7. The PPG is to be used to support the purchase of any necessary specific uniform items where appropriate.
8. The PPG is to be used to support the provision of one-to-one counselling support to improve SEMH for our disadvantaged students and the wider school community.
9. The PPG is to be used to increase the 'cultural capital' of our disadvantaged students allowing them to access a wide range of extra-curricular activities including: culturally enriching visits, educational visits and extra-curricular activities.
10. The PPG is to be used to support social mobility and access to University and College visits for our disadvantaged students.
11. The PPG is to be used to support the training of our Peer Mentor scheme to benefit both our disadvantaged students and the wider school community.
12. The PPG is to be used to ensure that all disadvantaged students start each school day hydrated and nourished so they are ready to learn.

The PPG is to be used to ensure that all students enter their public examinations hydrated and nourished in order to ensure they are physically prepared for them.
