To be considered for a place at Weald of Kent:

- 1. You must have named us on your secondary school application (we recommend you put us as first choice if you wish to join us)
- 2. Your child must be Grammar Assessed*

*If your child has not been assessed suitable for a place at a grammar school and you are choosing to appeal, you will need to have named us on your SCAF form in order to appeal.

Applications are ranked according to the oversubscription criteria

How are places allocated?

If we are oversubscribed, applications are ranked in the following order:



- 1. Children in Local Authority Care or Previously in Local Authority Care
- 2. Current Family Association
- 3. Health and Special Access Reasons
- 4. Pupil Premium
- 5. Children of Permanent Members of Staff
- 6. Distance A
 - Tonbridge Town is made up of TN9, TN10, TN11 and TN12 and the Parishes of Ightham, Ivy Hatch, Kings Hill, Pembury, Platt and St Mary's Platt, Plaxtol and Shipbourne.
 - The following Parishes within the Sevenoaks district are included: Brasted, Chevening, Chiddingstone, Cowden, Dunton Green, Edenbridge, Godden Green, Halstead, Hever, Kemsing, Knockholt, Leigh, Otford, Penshurst, Riverhead, Seal, Sevenoaks town, Sevenoaks Weald and Underriver, Shoreham, Sundridge and Ide Hill, Westerham and Crockham Hill
- 6. Distance B All other Postcodes

Waiting lists



- If you do not secure a place in the first round of offers you will be able to join our waiting list via KCC.
- The information on how to do this will be in your offer email from KCC.
- If you do not live in Kent, please check with your admissions department for their method, to be added to our waiting list.
- Waiting lists are held by KCC until 25 April.

Campus Allocations



- Successful in the first round? You could be offered either campus.
- A campus preference form will be emailed to parents and carers in your welcome email.
- The exact date of campus notification will be shared with you in your welcome email.

• A waiting list will be operated for any preferences that could not be allocated. This will be held until the first week of September.

Second Round Offers



25 April 2024

You will be notified by KCC via email or post.

• A welcome email will be sent to all successful applicants. Students will be allocated a campus dependant on availability.

What do I do if I am not offered a place?



We recommend completing both options below after the first round of offers.

1. Add your child to the waiting list by 15 March 2024 via the link in your offer email from KCC.

2. Appeal by 28 March 2024. The appeal information and form will be available on our website after the National Offer day.
